- Support civil society organisations to add value to/fill gaps in mainstream provision
- Contribute to raising attainment and skills by closing gap and supporting individuals at risk of exclusion
- Promote greater equity, diversity and inclusion and support learning as a force for change in communities

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- Lower life expectancy
- > Fewer healthy years of life
- More obesity, smoking and drinking; less physical activity
- Higher suicide rate

Integrated health/care plan involving NHS, councils and voluntary sector







- Address root causes of ill-health and health inequality
- Fund services that address gaps or add value e.g. diet, drinking, smoking, mental health
- Tackle health issues for people most at risk of exclusion







- Historic carbon production

- Address local environmental issues around climate, biodiversity etc.

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- ➤ Ensure everyone has opportunities to engage in culture
- Fund arts, heritage and sports to address social and economic challenges and opportunities
- Increase capacity of organisations through core support, volunteering and partnerships

But

Affordability of homes to buy and rent better than other regions







- Address root causes of homeless poverty, exclusion, health
- Support those inadequately housed, homeless or at risk
- Fund research, campaigning and influence on policy and practice







- Poverty, especially child poverty
- Low pay
- Lower and falling household wealth
- > Households with problem debt
- Increased demand on charities

Commitment to tackle poverty from NECA and business groups







- Help meet basic needs and people under most pressure.
- Fund charities so they can meet rising demand <u>and</u> rising costs
- Build long-term resilience by ensuring people can benefit from economic opportunities







- > Lower civic participation
- Connection between people of different backgrounds
- Lower levels of volunteering
- > Number of 'left-behind' neighbourhoods

- > Strong ties within communities
- Grassroots organising
- > Tradition of home-grown philanthropy





- ➤ Build bonds *in* and *between* communities, civic participation, community anchors
- Commit 1% pre-tax profit, support workbased volunteering and pro bono help
- Provide unrestricted, longer-term funding
- Invest in sector networks, infrastructure, volunteering, digital and data

Opportunity to address issues in a joined-up way with PCCs, LAs, CAs and expert charity organisations





- Fund prevention inc. work with young people, mediation, conflict resolution etc.
- Support victims specialist and community level services
- Help offenders make a fresh start to reduce re-offending
